#### Introduction

At this time of the year, it is usual to read and meditate on the birth of the LORD. However, this year, in the runup to Christmas, we shall reflect on the many prophecies His birth fulfilled. The prophecies pertain to (a) His lineage and identity (b) the location and timing of His birth (c) events surrounding His birth and (d) His purpose and divine nature. They reflect the extraordinary detail and divine planning that surrounded the birth of Jesus, reinforcing His identity as the promised Messiah. God never does anything until He reveals His plans to His servants the prophets. See Amos 3:7

After celebrating His birth, our focus shifts to His nature, attributes, and character. Who would want to worship an unknown God? What kind of King is He? What does He say about Himself? What have the prophets revealed about Him? What does He offer, and what does He require? Is He like us? Is He approachable and trustworthy? Is He worthy of our worship and obedience? Is He relatable, distant, personal, caring, merciful—or tyrannical?

The Scriptures present a profound and vivid picture of God: He is Spirit, calling for worship in spirit and truth. He is a triune Being, the essence of love, immutable, omnipotent, omnipresent, omniscient, good, holy, faithful, and wise.

God is not to be imagined as having partial measures of these attributes, as though they combine to make Him whole. He is not 15% love, 29% holy, and 78% wise. Rather, He embodies each attribute in its entirety. He is fully love, entirely holy, and completely merciful—all at the same time.

Eliphaz urges us to "acquaint yourself with Him and be at peace; thereby good will come to you" (Job 22:21).





### God is Spirit



#### John 4:19-24, BSB

<sup>19</sup> "Sir," the woman said, "I see that You are a prophet. <sup>20</sup>Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews say that the place where one must worship is in Jerusalem."

<sup>21</sup>"Believe Me, woman," Jesus replied, "a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. <sup>22</sup>You worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. <sup>23</sup>But a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth, for the Father is seeking such as these to worship Him. <sup>24</sup>God is Spirit, and His worshipers must worship Him in spirit and in truth."



The spiritual nature of God is inferable from many Scripture references but none as unequivocal as Jesus states it here in one of His sublimest revelations of God. God is Spirit. He has no visible substance, no physical, human body, nothing corporeal, no mixture of matter. God is invisible. Colossians 1:15, 1 Timothy 1:17.

No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is Himself God and is at the Father's side, has made Him known. [John 1:18]

Christmas is the season of celebration of the birth of Christ, God incarnate. Even though God is spirit, He is also a living, personal being. As such, we can know Him personally. Joshua 3:10 speaks of God in this way, saying, "You will know that the living God is among you." Psalm 84:2 declares, "My heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God" (ESV).

## Worship in Spirit & in Truth



#### John 4:19-24, BSB

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#### "Neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem"

Jesus demolishes the fallacy of holy places. God esteems no spots on earth holier than others. Holy buildings, holy forms, may have in them much value; but the value is for us, and not for God. All places are alike acceptable with God.

#### His worshipers <u>must</u> worship Him in spirit and in truth

The necessary and acceptable worship due God, from us, is "in spirit and truth." God won't ask of us what we are unable to do. His demand to be worshipped in spirit and in truth suggests that we can worship Him spiritually and truthfully. We are triune in nature, spirit, soul, and body [see 1 Thessalonians 5:23]. Our spirit and soul are the inward faculties with which we think, will, feel and act.

He wants our hearts before our bodies; the alignment of our spirit with His spirit; the subjection of our soul (mind, will and emotion) to our [born-again] spirit. Bodily posture—extended hands, bended knees, and eyes lifted up— are not sufficient acts of worship without a quickened and active spirit.

Worship in truth is conducted according to Word of God. John 17:17

### God is Love

#### Declarations of Scriptures



1 John 4:7-10, BSB

<sup>7</sup>Beloved, let us love one another, because love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. <sup>8</sup>Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.

<sup>9</sup>This is how God's love was revealed among us: God sent His one and only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. <sup>10</sup>And love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as the atoning sacrificed for our sins.

<sup>18</sup>There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear, because fear involves punishment. The one who fears has not been perfected in love.
<sup>19</sup>We love because He first loved us.



God does not simply love, but that He is Love itself. Love is not merely one of His attributes, but His very nature. God's love is free and uncaused. There was nothing whatever in us to attract or prompt it. (Deuteronomy 7:7-8, 2 Timothy 1:9)

A thing is said to change when it is otherwise now in regard of nature, state, will, or any quality than it was before; when either something is added to it, or taken from it; when it either loses or acquires. But now it is the essential property of God, not to have any accession to, or diminution of, his essence or attributes, but to remain entirely the same. He wants nothing; he loses nothing; but uniformly exists by himself, without any new nature, new thoughts, new will, new purpose, or new place.<sup>1</sup>

God is immutable in essence, nature, and perfections.

The power of God is that ability and strength to bring to pass whatsoever He pleases, whatsoever His infinite wisdom may direct, and whatsoever the infinite purity of His will may resolve. As holiness is the beauty of all God's attributes, so power is that which gives life and action to all the perfections of the divine nature. How vain would be the eternal counsels if power did not step in to execute them. Without power His mercy would be but feeble pity, His promises an empty sound, His threats a mere scarecrow.

God's power is like Himself: infinite, eternal, incomprehensible; it can neither be checked, restrained, nor frustrated by the creature (Stephen Charnock).

a. Deliberate on the many instances of the demonstrations of God's power in the Scriptures.



1. Praise God for being the ultimate source of all power and authority. 2. Ask for confidence in His ability to sustain and protect you in all circumstances. 3. Pray for the humility to align your desires and actions with His will. 4. Rejoice in the certainty of His promises and the security of His unchanging nature. 5. Call on God for strength and encouragement during seasons of difficulty or uncertainty. 6. Ask for peace that comes from trusting in His omnipotence.

Holiness is more than moral goodness. The Hebrew word for holiness means to be distinct, unique, or set apart because we are closely connected to God, who is the ultimate Holy One. The supreme unique Being. A call to holiness is therefore a call to a state in which we respect and honour God's holiness by dissociating from death and corruption.

So you must live as God's obedient children. Don't slip back into your old ways of living to satisfy your own desires. You didn't know any better then. But now you must be holy in everything you do, just as God who chose you is holy. For the Scriptures say, "You must be holy because I am holy." (1 Peter 1:14-16)

We are not bidden to be omnipotent or omniscient as God is, but we are to be holy.

1. Acknowledge that God is holy, set apart, and perfect in all His ways. Thank God for revealing His holiness and for calling us to live holy lives. 2. Thank God for being the one true God, unparalleled in majesty, power, and love. Pray for a deeper awareness of His uniqueness and the privilege of knowing Him. 3. Praise God for being steadfast and unchanging, a rock of refuge and strength. Pray for the faith to rely on Him completely, especially during times of uncertainty or difficulty. 4. Pray for a heart fully devoted to Him, free from idolatry or distractions.

Acknowledge and give thanks that God does not change, remaining constant and reliable in every season of life. Celebrate His faithfulness as a foundation for our hope and trust. 4. Ask God to help you grow in faithfulness in your relationships, commitments, and service to Him. Pray for the ability to reflect His character in your daily life, even in challenging circumstances. 5. Reaffirm your trust in God's promises, thanking Him that His faithfulness ensures their fulfilment.



Great is Thy faithfulness, O God my Father; There is no shadow of turning with Thee; Thou changest not, Thy compassions, they fail not; As Thou hast been Thou forever wilt be. God's wisdom is more than just His omniscience; it is the perfect application of His infinite knowledge. It is displayed especially in the fulfilment of His eternal purpose (see Ephesians 1:11). He uses everything in creation with precision and care, orchestrating all things to accomplish His divine will.

How often do we remember and acknowledge the only wise God? King Solomon is said to be the wisest man to have lived. After he became king, God appeared to him and told him to ask for whatever he wanted. Instead of asking for riches or power or length of his reign, Solomon asked for "an understanding mind" so that he would be able to rightly govern God's people. So, the LORD gave Solomon unsurpassed wisdom. Is God's wisdom available to us today?



1. Thank God for His infinite wisdom and perfect knowledge that surpass human understanding. 2. Thank God for the ways He reveals glimpses of His character and plans through His Word and Spirit. 3. Ask God to help you live a life that reflects His glory and aligns with His wisdom. 4. Pray to remain dependent on God's wisdom rather than leaning on your own understanding.

5. Ask God for a hunger to explore His Word and grow in understanding His nature and truth. 6. Pray for the Holy Spirit to guide you into a closer relationship with Him.
